Eight acres of chestnut trees, grass lawns, and public art encompass Eakins Oval, a public space which is transformed into a summer oasis called 'The Oval' from July 15 – August 21, 2016. The Oval, presented by PNC, is a partnership of the Fairmount Park Conservancy and Philadelphia Parks & Recreation.

The Oval, Philadelphia's "Park on the Parkway" located on the southeastern end of the Benjamin Franklin Parkway, has free programming, events, and activities for all ages. The Oval features interactive games, special events including live music, movie nights, performances, and workshops, as well as a rotating lineup of food trucks and a beautiful beer garden. Special events will take place during the Democratic National Convention in July. The City of Philadelphia Mural Arts Program will create a large mural on the ground to bring more colorful summer fun to the pop-up park. A ground mural,

covering 25,000 square feet, will be installed by Mural Arts beginning after the Welcome America July 4th celebrations conclude. The Oval is presented by PNC Bank with additional support from Warby Parker and Park Towne Place. The Oval, at Eakins Oval, is at the center of the Ben Franklin Parkway at 2451 Benjamin Franklin Parkway, Philadelphia, PA 19130.
