CEDAR GROVE

1 Cedar Grove Dr.,
Philadelphia, PA 19131

YEAR BUILT: 1748 **ARCHITECTURE:** Colonial
HISTORICAL NOTES: Originally built by the Morris family in the Frankford section of Philadelphia, this house was moved stone by stone to its present home in Fairmount Park between 1926-1928.

FEATURED CIDERIES:

Frecon's Cidery, Boyertown, PA
Dressler Estate, Downingtown, PA

VARIETIES:

Farmhouse ABV 7.2% **SWEETNESS:** Tart
TASTING NOTES: A slightly funky and sour taste with just a hint of oak.

Early Man ABV 5.5% **SWEETNESS:** Dry
TASTING NOTES: Crisp with a light fruitiness that preserves those last remaining notes of summer.

Dressler Modern Still on Nitro ABV 7.3%
SWEETNESS: Dry
TASTING NOTES: Smooth and clean finish, with light floral and fruit aromas.

LAUREL HILL MANSION

7201 N. Randolph Dr.,
Philadelphia, PA

YEAR BUILT: 1767 **ARCHITECTURE:** Georgian
HISTORICAL NOTES: Built by wealthy widow Rebecca Rawle, a British loyalist, this house was seized during the Revolution and eventually repurchased by Ms. Rawle afterwards.

FEATURED CIDER:

Ploughman, Adam's County, PA

VARIETIES:

Kenspeckle ABV 8.5% **SWEETNESS:** Dry
Tasting notes: Slightly tannic, with strawberry and cherry aromas.

Lupulin LummoX ABV 8.5%
SWEETNESS: Light sweetness
TASTING NOTES: Big and brassy, yet balanced.

Dornick ABV 8.5% **SWEETNESS:** Dry
TASTING NOTES: Stony, pebbly quality, robust apple with aromas of strawberry, butterscotch, and autumn leaves.

Muhibbah ABV 8.5% **SWEETNESS:** Dry
TASTING NOTES: Makrut lime leaves, star anise, cumin and coriander.

LEMON HILL MANSION

Sedgely Dr. and Lemon Hill Dr.,
Philadelphia, PA 19130

YEAR BUILT: 1800
ARCHITECTURE: Neo-classical/Federal
HISTORICAL NOTES: This house first served as a summer home for wealthy merchant Henry Pratt in the 1800s, as well as a German beer garden, and the home of the first director of the Philadelphia Museum of Art, Fiske Kimball. It was the first property acquired by the city for the eventual creation of Fairmount Park.

FEATURED CIDERIES:

VARIETIES:

Cherry Pie ABV 7% **SWEETNESS:** Off-dry
TASTING NOTES: A fresh and sparkling cider with highlights of tart Montmorency cherries.

Spy v. Spy ABV 7% **SWEETNESS:** Dry
TASTING NOTES: Tart lemon notes and dry earthy apple flavors with lingering fruit notes.

Sour Batch Watermelon ABV 7%
SWEETNESS: Sweet **TASTING NOTES:** Sour and sweet not unlike a candy with a similar name.

Untamed ABV 7% **SWEETNESS:** Dry
TASTING NOTES: A crisp, tart, refreshing flavor.

MOUNT PLEASANT

3800 Mt. Pleasant Dr.,
Philadelphia, PA 19121

YEAR BUILT: 1765 **ARCHITECTURE:** Georgian
HISTORICAL NOTES: Built by the colorful privateer, John Macpherson, it was known as one of the grandest homes along the Schuylkill, one that John Adams on a visit to the residence in 1775, declared "the most elegant seat in Pennsylvania."

FEATURED CIDER:

Hardball Cider, Bethlehem, PA

VARIETIES:

Splitter ABV 5.5% **SWEETNESS:** Semi-sweet
TASTING NOTES: Strong apple flavor and a little added fizz.

Curveball ABV 6.9% **SWEETNESS:** Sweet
TASTING NOTES: A light and sweet carbonated cider.

Sunday Hop ABV 6.5% **SWEETNESS:** Dry
TASTING NOTES: Citrus

HISTORIC STRAWBERRY MANSION

2450 Strawberry Mansion Dr.,
Philadelphia, PA 19132

YEAR BUILT: 1789 **ARCHITECTURE:** Federal
HISTORICAL NOTES: Formerly known as "Summerville", this house was built by Judge William Lewis who drafted the first law abolishing slavery in America. The house also served as a popular park restaurant and it is said that its present name was derived from the strawberries and cream served here.

VARIETIES:

Gold Rush

Unfiltered Grapefruit

WOODFORD MANSION

3400 West Dauphin Dr.
Philadelphia, PA 19132

YEAR BUILT: 1756 **ARCHITECTURE:** Georgian with Federal influences
HISTORICAL NOTES: Summer home of George Clymer, signer of the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution, as well as the Franks family, British loyalists eventually ordered to leave for Britain, and presently home to the extensive Naomi Woods' collection of colonial objects.

FEATURED CIDER:

Kurant, Perkasio, PA

VARIETIES:

Spice ABV 5.8%
SWEETNESS: Off Dry / Semi-Sweet
TASTING NOTES: Cinnamon, nutmeg, all spice, brown sugar, molasses and raisons.

Earth ABV 5.8% **SWEETNESS:** Dry
TASTING NOTES: Light citrus and melon character, made with 100% Mosaic hops
